RULES AND REGULATIONS

Cooyar Agricultural Show 2026

1. Membership 2025-2026. Double/Family \$40.00, Single \$20.00. (DISCOUNT – Double/Family \$30.00, Single \$15.00, if paid before 31st December 2025). Family membership includes 2 adults and all children 15 years and under as of 31st December 2025. Adult membership is 16 years and over as of 1st January 2026. This gives free admission to the Show Grounds for the Functions, which the Society conducts during the membership year.
2. The Certificate of Entry is a printed form to be obtained from the Secretary, which the Exhibitor must fill in and sign. This is urgent and absolutely necessary. The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to Special Regulations, which appear in this schedule.
3. All Livestock Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor for at least one month prior to the Show.
4. Any Competitor failing to give full and correct performance, descriptions, brands and breeder's name when requested will be liable to have the whole of his/her prize money forfeited to the Society. Stock parade in ring as advised. All eligible stock must parade.
5. Pavilion exhibits are to be in place and ready for judging by 12noon on Friday, 20th February. PHOTOGRAPHY exhibits, however, are to be in place between 8 – 10am Wednesday 18th February. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. Judging is to commence at 1pm on sections 3-7 in the Pavilion; Photography judging commences at 9am and Art judging commences at 10am. Stud Cattle exhibits are to be in by 7am on Show Day.
6. Agricultural and Horticultural exhibits and articles of Household use must be homegrown.
7. All Livestock exhibits must remain on the grounds until 3pm on Show Day. No Exhibitor will be allowed to remove or in any way interfere with any exhibited article until 3.30pm on Show Day, Pavilion exhibits – 5pm. The Pavilion will be closed at 4:30pm to allow Stewards to prepare exhibits for collection. Exhibits can be collected between 5pm and 6pm. Gate passes are not available to waive Admission on Show Day to collect exhibits. The pavilion will be opened 9am Sunday following Show Day for any remaining exhibits to be collected.
8. The Secretary shall furnish each judge with a detailed catalogue of exhibits to be judged.P
9. The Stewards shall see that the Judges are furnished with a detailed schedule of events. They must also supply them with badges and afford them all attention and information necessary for the discharge of their duties.
10. The Judges shall have the power to withhold any prize should they consider the exhibit to be of insufficient merit. The decision of the Judge shall be final.
11. All persons shall be subject to the regulations of the Stewards. Stewards shall have the power to remove Exhibitors or other persons from the vicinity of the judge whilst judging if they are deemed to be causing a nuisance.
12. The Society reserves the right of refusal to admit any exhibit into the grounds where there is reason to suspect that the exhibit is either diseased or dangerous. If detected after admission, removal from the grounds can be ordered.
13. No award ribbon other than those awarded at the current show shall be placed on any exhibit whilst in the Show Ground, without the consent of the Stewards for the section in which it is entered.
14. NO Entry Fee is necessary for the Championship in any section and only First and Second prize will be eligible for Championships. No animal is to compete in Championships unless entered in classes.
15. Exhibitors of Livestock must make their own arrangements for feeding their stock. Any Exhibitor removing his or her exhibits from the grounds before the appointed time may be disqualified and prize money, if any, forfeited.
16. The decision of the Stewards regarding the arranging of exhibits shall be final.
17. All cattle are to be judged in the ring. When paraded in the ring cattle must have a nose grip.
18. Stewards will obtain Prize Cards and Ribbons from the Secretary and affix same to the exhibits, after filling in names of successful exhibitors and other particulars.

19. All prize monies and trophies will be, where possible, paid on Show Day. Exhibitors are to collect prize monies and trophies between 10am and 3pm. Livestock prize money will be awarded following the Grand Parade.
20. The Official Opening will be held at 2.45pm following the Grand Parade at 2.30pm in which the winning stock must take part. Prize money will be awarded following the Grand Parade. Any Livestock exhibits not taking part in the Parade will forfeit prize money and the owner subject to a fine.
21. The Society will not, in any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage, or misdelivery of any Livestock or Exhibit at the Show.
22. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may occur to any exhibit at the Show, and it shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from the accident.
23. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property of the Show, but Exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society.
24. 3 percent of the Gross Proceeds for the sale of any Livestock or Produce Exhibits on the Show Grounds must be paid to the Show Society, and agents are requested to please note this regulation.
25. The Committee may abandon the exhibition of any event thereof because of wet weather or any other reason that may make such course advisable. Should the exhibition of any event be abandoned or cancelled, exhibitors shall be entitled to a return of their entrance fee paid, but no cause for liability or obligation shall be maintained or be incurred by reason of such abandonment or cancellation.
26. The Society reserves the right to substitute Special Prizes which may be later donated for any of the Scheduled Prizes.
27. Protests must be lodged to the Secretary, in writing, accompanied by a fee of \$10.00 not later than 2 hours after the judging of an event being protested. The deposit in any protest considered by the Committee to be frivolous will be forfeited to the Society.
28. No collector shall be allowed on the grounds except those authorized by the Committee, and any person infringing this Regulation may be removed by a Committee member with or without Police assistance.
29. Persons requiring space on the Show Grounds during the Show must apply to the Secretary.
30. Any exhibit not ready for judging at the time specified for judging may be disqualified.
31. All Electrical Equipment must be tagged.
32. **Any persons with dogs will be asked to leave the grounds. If you are a competitor your entries will be forfeited – THE NO DOG POLICY WILL BE ENFORCED.**

V3 – November 2023

To be eligible for Sub Chamber and State Finals, competitors must comply with ALL rules noted below. Agricultural Society and Sub Chamber Stewards and Coordinators are to ensure relevant rules are consistently enforced for competitions under their control.

Competition Rules

1 Age of Competitors

1.1 Competitors must be aged between 15 years of age and under 25 years as at the 1st May in the year of the State Finals.

1.2 Competitors under the age of 18 years must have the approval of a parent or guardian to compete and the appropriate waiver signed on the nomination form.

1.3 Different age classes may be added to programs at local show level. These classes will not be recognised at Sub Chamber or State Finals.

2 Eligibility to Compete

2.1 Competitors must meet one of the following criteria -

- (a) A Queensland resident for a minimum of three (3) months prior to competing;
- (b) Attend a Queensland educational institution;
- (c) Residing interstate but can prove a connection with a Queensland Agricultural Society and satisfy one of the following criteria:
 - (i) Permanent address has a Queensland postcode;
 - (ii) Competitor or parents are active working members of that Agricultural Society.

2.2 To be eligible to compete at Sub Chamber Finals, competitors must have won in a similar class at a local agricultural show competition. In the event that the local winner is ineligible or unavailable the Runner Up becomes eligible.

2.3 Competitors can represent only one (1) Show in the Sub Chamber Final. Competitors represent the first show with which they became eligible.

2.4 Sub Chamber Winners are eligible to compete at State Final. In the event that the Winner is unable to compete the next highest placed available competitor is eligible.

2.5 Competitors can represent only one (1) Sub Chamber in the State Final. Competitors represent the first Sub Chamber with which they became eligible.

2.6 Winners of similar competitions at the Royal Queensland Show will be invited to compete in the State Final provided they are eligible under these rules.

2.7 Previous National winners are ineligible to compete at any level of competition.

Paraders competitions are designed to determine the Parader who presents and parades an animal before a judge most effectively.

3 Entry Forms

3.1 Entry Forms are available at www.qldagshows.com.au

3.2 An Entry Form must be completed by all competitors at local Agricultural Show level.

3.3 Local Agricultural Show Stewards are to:

- (a) Ensure Entry Forms are completed for all competitors and waivers are duly signed by eligible persons;
- (b) Annotate the WINNER and RUNNER-UP Entry Forms appropriately (section included for local details);
- (c) Forward WINNER and RUNNER-UP Entry Forms to the Agricultural Society hosting the Sub Chamber final; and
- (d) Forward a copy of WINNER and RUNNER-UP Entry Forms are sent to the Sub Chamber Coordinator/Secretary.

3.4 Separate Entry Forms must be completed for each competition entered.

3.5 Once all WINNER and RUNNER UP entry forms are received by the Sub Chamber Coordinator, eligible competitors (Winners for each Agricultural Show) are to be invited to be complete at Sub Chamber Finals. Competitors should be advised of time and place as soon as possible after decisions are made. IF a Winner is unable to attend the Sub Chamber Coordinator is to take immediate action to invite the Runner Up or next eligible competitor.

4 Parader Competitions Special Rules

4.1 Paraders will parade their animals in a clockwise manner as is normal in a Cattle Judging Ring at the discretion of the Judge.

4.2 No glitter is permissible on animals or paraders. Cattle are to be presented in their natural, clean state.

4.3 Stud Beef Paraders must wear a white dust coat and not display any name or logo at the Steward's discretion.

4.4 Paraders will not wear lace up footwear to parade any animal to ensure compliance with workplace health and safety regulations.

4.5 Beef Cattle Paraders may lead a Steer, Heifer or Bull under 20 months.

4.6 For safety reasons, Judges are not permitted to ask competitors in Young Parader Competitions to swap animals at the local show level.

NOTE: Affiliated Shows may decide to run other age groups, this is permissible, HOWEVER, all Sub Chamber Finals are to be run as per the State Finals RULES. All entry forms are to be completed correctly.

NOTE: This is not recommended at Sub Chamber level, however, competitors must be aware that swapping of animals may occur at State and National Levels of this competition. If it is deemed necessary to swap animals, prior to the commencement of judging, Stewards are to consult with the owners of the beasts to ascertain if their animals can be switched between handlers. Stewards are to advise Judges that switching of animals is only to be considered if agreed to by the Owners and when absolutely necessary to achieve a result.

4.7 At Sub Chamber and State Finals, one (1) class of Paraders is to be judged.

4.8 At Sub Chamber and State Finals, Paraders must be willing to swap animals, if required.

5 Young Judges Competition Special Rules

5.1 Hormel Slide OR Computerised Judging Scoring System must be used at all levels in the Young Judges Competition. Please note that Hormel Slides are no longer available and have been replaced by the Computerised Judging Scoring System. The Computerised Judging Scoring System is an Excel spreadsheet and is available at www.qldagshows.com.au under Queensland Ag Shows Competitions | Young Judges and Paraders.

5.2 In all competitions four (4) exhibits NUMBER 1, 2 3 and 4 are to be used to suit the scoring from the Hormel Slide.

5.3 Where possible competitions should have the following classes:

(a) Stud Beef 3 classes to be used (e.g. British, Tropical, European)

(b) Prime Beef 3 classes to be used (e.g. Jap Ox, Korean, Local Trade, etc.)

5.4 Led Commercial Cattle can be used as an alternative when Prime Cattle facilities are not available.

6 Competition (Procedures and Guidelines)

6.1 The Competitions are conducted in accordance with the Rules set by Agricultural Shows Australia (ASA) for National Finals. The Agricultural Shows Australia Rules (Handbooks) can be found on the ASA website www.agshowsaustralia.org.au/member-resources/national-competitions-guidelines/

6.2 Visual Judging - Judging time six (6) minutes per class

6.3 Oral speaking tests- two (2) minutes per class

6.4 Penalty points apply. 1 point for every ten (10) seconds over your allotted two (2) minutes will be deducted.

6.5 The Overjudge must not have access to any Master Score Sheets.

DIVISION 1 – STUD BEEF CATTLE

ALL CATTLE TO BE TAGGED WITH NLIS DEVICE

All animals entered for competition must be registered with their respective Breed Society and entered in the Herd Book. The age of the cattle in this section is to be actual age on 1st February. Cattle are to be on the grounds by 7.00am Show Day. Judging will commence at 8am. Open to all registered Breeds. State the breed of animal on the Entry Form. Kindly complete and forward Entry Forms to the Secretary prior to Wednesday 18th February. Entry Fees can be paid by EFT using your PIC as reference, or by cash on Show Day, **prior** to the commencement of judging.

N.B. – All Breeds will be judged as Bos-Indicus and Bos-Taurus.

N.B. – All bulls over 12 months of age must have a nose ring. A nose grip or ring must be in all other cattle that are paraded.

- Classes 21, 22 and 23 will be judged as Interbreed.
- Calves shown on cows are ineligible for other classes.
- No cattle that have competed in Division 1 are to compete in Division 2.
- The Official Opening will be held at 2.45pm following the Grand Parade at 2.30pm in which the winning stock must take part. Prize money will be awarded following the Grand Parade. Any Livestock exhibits not taking part in the Parade will forfeit prize money and the owner subject to a fine.







Caramel Walnut Slice

Base – ½ cup SR flour, ¼ cup sugar, ½ cup coconut, 60g butter

Topping – 2 eggs, ½ tsp vanilla, 1 cup coconut, 90g walnut pieces, 1 ½ cups brown sugar, ½ tsp baking powder.

Topping - Lightly beat eggs and vanilla with fork, add coconut, walnuts, brown sugar and baking powder, and mix well. Spread mixture over base and return to oven for a further 25 minutes or until topping is cooked. Cool in tin, then cut into 5 cm square pieces.

Anzac Biscuits

1 cup rolled oats

¾ cup coconut

1 cup self-raising flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

2 tablespoons boiling water

1 cup sugar

½ cup butter

1 tablespoon syrup

Mix the flour, oats, coconut, sugar and a pinch of salt together in a mixing bowl. Melt the syrup and butter in a saucepan. Mix the soda with the boiling water and add to the melted butter and syrup. While this is frothing add to the dry ingredients and mix well. Roll small amounts of the mixture in your hands, flatten out and place onto a greased tray. Bake in a moderate oven for 10 to 15 minutes.

Mars Bar Slice

3 tablespoons butter

3 Mars Bars

3 cups Rice Bubbles

Melt butter and Mars Bars. Stir in the Rice Bubbles. Press into a slice tray and refrigerate. When set cut into 5 cm squares.

Lazy Daisy Cake

125g butter

4 level tablespoons sugar

½ packet jelly crystals (any colour)

2 eggs

1 1/3 cups SR flour

1/3 cup milk

Combine all ingredients in mixing bowl until blended. Beat for 3 minutes on medium speed

- 2 tbs boiling water
- ¾ cup desiccated coconut

Method:

Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased over trays and flatten slightly.

Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown. Cool on tray.

SHOW EXHIBIT HINTS & TIPS

COOKING

- ALWAYS READ THE COMPETITION SCHEDULE AND DO WHAT IT SAYS. The judge judges on what is written in the Schedule, eg if you enter a round cake & the Schedule says a square one, your cake will be put out of the competition.
- Try to use silver cake tins/pans. Non-stick pans make cakes cook too brown.
- Have ingredients - milk, butter, eggs etc at room temperature. In Summer, the butter can get too soft, put it back in the fridge to harden up for a while. In Winter it is a bit harder, soften the butter in the microwave & even slightly warm the milk in a saucepan on the stove, but, test and watch it.
- Have your scales, measuring cups & spoons at hand. Always weigh & measure the ingredients.
- Before using SR Flour, tip your flour container up and down a few times to re-distribute the rising in the flour. It settles to the bottom when not in use.
- Always make sure the sugar is mixed/melted into the butter when beating butter & sugar together at the beginning. You can even add a little hot water to help. The sugar can show on the top of the cake, when cooked, especially with a Sultana Cake, but can show on others as well.
- Greasing your cake tin - I use butter to grease the tin & also flour (plain) it. Some cooks use non-stick paper in the bottom (I would grease it). I use brown paper, cut to size, for fruit cakes like Boiled Fruit Cake & Sultana Cake. For Rich Fruit Cakes the tin must be lined on bottoms & sides. This becomes a bit of trial & error, do what your Mother does, or what works for you!!
- Most good cooks do not put the last of their mixture into the cake tin. But I put the last in (save waste) & mix it in lightly with the rest of batter with the paddle scraper. When you judge especially with fruit cakes, you can see where the last of the mixture went in - there will be a patch with no fruit.
- After the cake batter is put in your cake tin & evened out, lift the tin up & drop from a height of 12-14cms & let drop down onto the table, several times. This breaks the air bubbles or brings them to the top and you get a better textured cake, without holes, hopefully.
- When getting the flour out of your container, don't dip the cup measure in to fill up. Fill the cup measure with a smaller measure, thereby adding air into the flour, making it lighter.
- Set a timer when the cake goes into the oven & when it goes off, look in the oven & if the cake is coming away from the sides of the tin, it is cooked. If it is not coming away from the sides, turn timer on for another 5 mins & check again. Sometimes, you might have to leave it in for another 5 mins, but check the top of your cake for brownness, as well. Hopefully, your cake will be cooked & coming away from the sides of the tin. Doing this alleviates the need for using cake testers. If you need to use a tester, put it into the cake away from the centre. When judging cakes, you can see where the mark, where a tester has gone in & this spoils the cake.
- In Show cooking, cake cooler marks are a no-no on the bottom of your cakes. I use linen tea towels folded in quarters & non-stick paper halved or quartered on top of the tea towel, to put cooling racks. Use this method for 2 cake coolers, 1 for tipping the cake onto (out of the tin) & the other for turning it back onto its bottom. It means a bit more effort, but there will be no marks on the bottom of the cake.

- Keep the icing on cakes very simple, no need for butter cream icing, unless stated in the Schedule. Just use a bit of butter, hot water & icing sugar with colouring, if needed, & a few drops of glycerine to keep the icing from going hard. Smooth the icing over with a knife dipped in hot water & then run the knife around the edges of the cake to neaten off. All makes for good presentation of your entry.
- When making pikelets, use tablespoons of mixture & tip onto pan/plate, point down. It keeps them round and the right size for Show Cooking. Technically, you should turn a pikelet just before the bubbles appear on top. This is very hard to do, but once again trial and error!! When you bend/break a pikelet, you should see a line in the middle of the pikelet when/where it has been turned.
- Try, if possible, to enter scones from the very first cutting. A judge can pick the scones, from the bottoms, if a scone has been taken from a second rolling - it has join lines on it. Always brush the flour off your scones with a soft linen tea towel or cloth.
- It is unnecessary to put decorations on cakes, unless stated in Schedule. Decorations in the middle of a cake can drag down through the cake when cut, & can spoil the texture of the cake. If you want to decorate, put it on the corners of the cake.

JAMS & JELLIES

- Jar size matters. A judge will be able to see more consistency in texture in a larger exhibit (up to 500g).
- Jellies are clear with a 'set' texture.
- Fill jams and butters to the neck of the bottle, not further.
- Marmalade – rind should be cut fine.

HORTICULTURE

FLORAL BOWLS:

- Containers will be provided by the Cooyar Agricultural Society for Floral Bowl entries.
- Floral bowls are to be filled to the top of the bowl with WET sand.
- Flowers and foliage should totally cover the surface, with no sand showing.
- Greenery or flowers can spill over the edge of the bowl slightly.
- Do not use a full bloom flower or rose in the centre of the bowl, preferably use buds.
- If using succulents or cacti, use a full cactus in the centre and surround with smaller cacti.
- A dome can be created by using slightly taller stems in the centre of the bowl.

FLOWERS:

- When a flower colour is specified, the exhibit must be only that colour, no coloured stamens or varied petals.

ARRANGEMENTS:

- The mounting board is to be fully covered with sand, pebbles, bark, fern, etc.

PHOTOGRAPHY *Comments from previous years' judges*

- Avoid straight lines (rails, brick walls etc.) that can detract from the main subject. Check the backgrounds to avoid it being too 'busy'.
- Aim for a main focal point. Be aware when taking photos or cropping, to capture the full subject, ie not cutting off animal paws, arms/hands/feet etc of people.
- Photos that 'tell a story' are always more interesting.
- Full class description should be followed: Child at Play, Person at Work, Person with Animals or Pets
- Ensure that photos are professionally printed, do not use a home printer for Show entries.
- Colour theme – to be predominantly the stipulated colour.
- Landscape – 1/3 sky, 2/3 land
- Waterscene – 2/3 water, 1/3 land. Ensure that the water component is the main feature of the photo.
- Seascape – Watch level of the horizon.
- Sunrise / Sunset – should have the sun, or at least part of the sun, in the photo, but some judges will disagree.
- Tree – Centred or to the side, no definite rule.
- Flower study – Include flower / flowers only, no bugs, beetles etc.
- Still life – should not show living things (eg. Foliage) in the background. Watch that the background does not detract from the subject.
- Portraits – Portrait photos are better taken slightly off-side, focusing mainly on the eye or bridge of the nose, not taken directly in front of the subject to avoid attention being drawn to the nose or chin. Ideally, have a clear ('clutter-free') background.
